

The Colorado Landowner Preference Program (LPP) is an initiative by Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) designed to encourage private landowners to manage their land for wildlife benefit. Here's a breakdown of the program's goals and how it works:

### Goals:

- **Incentivize Wildlife Habitat Management:** By giving preference for hunting licenses, LPP encourages landowners to create and maintain habitats that support healthy wildlife populations. This benefits all hunters, not just those on private lands.
- **Discourage Game Harboring:** LPP discourages landowners from keeping elk and deer on their property during public hunting seasons. This ensures fairer hunting opportunities for everyone.
- **Reduce Public Land Pressure:** By increasing hunting opportunities on private lands, LPP helps alleviate pressure on public lands, making hunting experiences more enjoyable for everyone.

### How it Works:

- **Land Registration:** Landowners with at least 160 acres of contiguous land that meets specific wildlife habitat criteria can register their property with CPW by December 1st to be eligible for the following year's program. Registrations are valid for up to five years.
- **Preference for Licenses:** Registered landowners receive preference in the draw for licenses to hunt specific big game species, like elk and deer. This increases their chances of getting a license compared to those applying in the general draw.
- **Voucher Transfer (Optional):** Landowners can choose to transfer their LPP voucher to another hunter who is legally eligible for the license. Permission to access and hunt the entire registered land for the entire season must be included in the transfer, and landowners cannot discriminate among hunters based on factors beyond access methods (foot, horseback, etc.)

**Overall, the LPP program aims to strike a balance between providing opportunities for hunters and encouraging responsible wildlife management on private lands in Colorado.**
