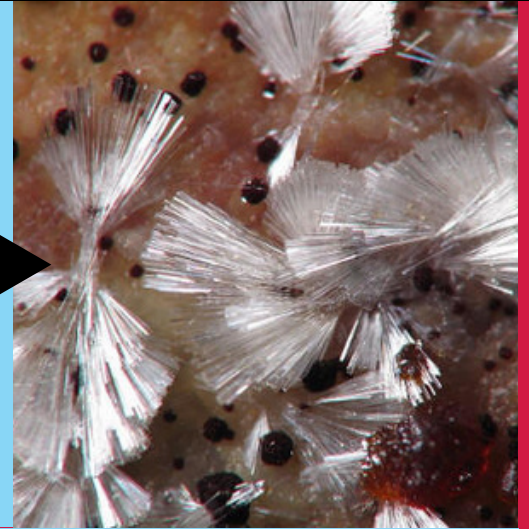


# Tiptopite
