STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (USE ADDITIONAL SHEETS IF NECESSARY): The Jacob Jones Farm is a large assortment of agricultural buildings and a house. Most of the seventeen surviving structures were constructed between 1900 and 1910 by master carpenter Gene Chamberlin. Barn #2 exhibits best, the fine joinery of this craftsman.

The farm was one of Roseburg's major producers of agricultural products. It has yielded beef, hogs and sheep which were processed in the meat and smokehouse, west of the main house, before marketing. Milk, turkeys, hatching eggs and vegetables were also produced on the farm since 1900.

Jacob (1854-1940) was born on his father's (John) Donation Land Claim in Winchester, Oregon. His grandfather, Jacob W. Jones (1790-1891), claimed and settled a section of land in Garden Valley in 1852. This Donation Land Claim abuts the northern property line of grandson Jacob's farm. The Jacob Jones Farm remained in the family until mid-1960's when it was sold to the present owner.

acob W. and his son Isaac owned the Roseburg Flouring Mills on Deer Creek in Roseburg. (See Jones, Isaac Grist Mill Site: Statewide nventory of Historic Sites and Buildings, Douglas County. Oregon State Historic Preservation Office, 1976.)

A griststone from the mill is situated approximately 100 feet west of the Jacob Jones house. It is now used as a base for bee hives.

One of the first community meeting houses in the city was built on a small hill at the eastern edge of the Jones' farm. It served both as a school and a Methodist-Episcopal Church. The second quarterly meeting for the Regional Church was held here in 1855. In the contemporary, Sane Orderly Development (SOD) organized June 10, 1979 on the farm. It organized to oppose a proposed sewage treatment plant and highway extension on agricultural land in the vicinity of the Jones' farm. Since then it has expanded as a political voice to promote the wise use of all agricultural and other resource lands in Douglas County.

The Jones Granary is situated approximately 50 yards directly north of the Jacob Jones house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (USE ADDITIONAL SHEETS IF NECESSARY): According to Myra (Jones) Daniels, Gene Chamberlin built this granary for Jacob Jones in 1907. The granary is one of the largest and probably the best maintained granary in rural Douglas County. The craftsmanship of the finely executed mortise and tenon joints is carried throughout the building.

The Jones family took residence in the granary while the main house was under construction. Each member occupied a grain bin as a bedroom. See Jones, Jacob Farm for more information.
